RURAL SAFETY

The Democratic Alliance has been fighting for the safety of farmers, farm workers and rural communities in South Africa for many years. The scourge against rural communities has largely been ignored by government and has resulted in brutal attacks and the victimization of farmers and farm workers.

The DA has established a work stream on farm safety made up of representatives from across the country. This work stream has updated the original rural safety plan put forward by the DA. This has been submitted to the President and the Minister of Police as part of our proactive efforts to improve rural safety.

The DA has also established the Court Watching Briefs programme aimed at tracking and monitoring cases of farm murders and attacks. This is to ensure that SAPS and the Justice system ensure that justice is served.

In KwaZulu-Natal the DA is fighting for farm watches and farm patrols to be subsidized by government as well as the establishment of an interministerial committee on rural safety, amongst others.

The disproportionate crime statistics against farmers and farm workers should be of concern to all SOuth Africans. The DA will continue to proavtivly find solutions and present them to the government and we will continue to fight for the protection of rural communities.

The DA's victory in getting farm murders as an item for debate in the National Assembly has placed farm murders on the National agenda.



PROTESTORS DISRUPT MUNICIPAL SERVICES

UMngeni residents have been held hostage by a group of about 20 ANC members/supporters who have blocked the entrance of the municipal offices and stop municipal vehicles from leaving their depots.

It is absurd to think that the R18 million a year security services and the Public Order Policing freely allow this small group to disrupt services for thousands. Unfortunately, it is obvious that there are different rules and consequences for different people in our municipality and country.

At the core of the protests are promises made by the mayor and other councillors for jobs and contracts to ANC supporters. These have not materialised and now uMngeni is suffering.

The DA has called on the ANC's Provincial Chairperson, Sihle Zikalala (who is also the Premier) to get his members under control and bring the protest to an end. Zikalala has confirmed that he will intervene but to date there has been no end to the protests. The DA has given him until Thursday 5 November to end the protest thereafter, we will be going to National Minister of Cooperative the Traditional Affairs Governance and to intervene.

On Monday the 2nd of November DA councillor Janis Holmes was assaulted by protestors while gathering photo evidence of the alleged involvement of municipal staff in the protest. She has since opened a case at SAPS Howick.

It is unacceptable that infighting, illegal promises and factionalism must be tolerated while garbage piles up.
